All Virginia Lawmakers Have a Stake in Expanding Medicaid



Uninsured Virginians are in every district across the commonwealth

Virginia lawmakers should provide needed health care coverage to hundreds of thousands of Virginians who live and work in the communities they represent by expanding access to health care through Medicaid.

This issue brief provides estimates of the number of low-income, uninsured Virginians who reside in the localities associated with each Virginia House and Senate district. As the numbers show, hundreds – even thousands – of residents in the localities served by every member stand to gain coverage through Medicaid expansion.

Opportunity for Coverage

Under the Affordable Care Act (ACA), Virginia can allow those earning up to 138 percent of the federal poverty level (FPL) – about \$26,000 for a family of three – to get health insurance through Medicaid. The expanded eligibility would primarily help parents and other working adults who aren't offered coverage through their jobs and can't afford coverage on their own.

If Virginia expands coverage, the federal government will pay for 100 percent of the costs in the first three years (2014-2016), and no less than 90 percent after that. Federal funding for Medicaid expansion in Virginia would total more than \$22 billion over the next nine years (2014-2022), with Virginia chipping in far less.


Lawmakers Should Expand Medicaid

Virginia lawmakers need to vote to accept the federal dollars already allocated to the state for Medicaid expansion, so that thousands of people in their districts can get the coverage they need to be healthy and productive. (See Tables 1 and 2, on pages 3-7.)

Many of the people who could get coverage are working in the most important parts of the state's economy – tourism, retail trade, and construction – and yet they struggle to get the coverage they need. That's because their jobs often

don't offer health insurance or pay them enough to afford coverage even if it is offered.

The choice is clear: Virginia lawmakers should do what's best for their constituents and expand Medicaid as soon as possible.

Determining the Number of Uninsured

Each year, the U.S. Census Bureau produces annual estimates of health insurance coverage by locality. The most recent data are available for 2011. Using the Census Bureau estimates, those eligible for coverage through Medicaid expansion, namely people ages 19 to 64 who have incomes below 138 percent FPL and lack health insurance, were identified for each locality.

Locality-based estimates were then added together for each member to arrive at the number of uninsured people who will be newly eligible for coverage in the communities that the members' districts include.

Data limitations prohibit calculating more precise estimates of eligibility by legislative district. Many members' districts cut across local boundaries, and so the estimates in Tables 1 and 2 may include some Virginians who live near, but not in, a member's district. With the level of data available, it is impossible to know how a particular locality's uninsured population is distributed within the locality and, thus, what share of the uninsured population is represented by a particular elected member of the House or Senate in a locality that is split between two or more legislative districts.

For example, Delegate Steve Landes' district includes parts of Albemarle, Augusta, and Rockingham County, and as a result, the three localities that he represents have 9,750 uninsured adults eligible for coverage through Medicaid expansion.

One consequence of using the locality based data without further breakdown is that multiple members are listed as representing some localities, and especially more populous localities such as Fairfax County. As a result, the number of individuals eligible for Medicaid through expansion should not be summed across districts to arrive at a statewide estimate.

Overall, the state's Medicaid office estimates that as many as 400,000 Virginians could be eligible for coverage through expansion.
