

Comparing proposed amendments to the 2018-2020 budget

The House and Senate have adopted proposed changes to the 2018-2020 budget (FYs 2019 and 2020). The chart below provides a summary level assessment of certain key changes and other noteworthy information proposed by the governor, House, and Senate compared to the enacted budget (Chapter 2, Acts of Assembly 2018).

Dollar figures, excluding totals where noted, represent combined FY19 and FY20 changes in general fund (GF) spending.
